# Introduction

How do museums collect media art? Where do private collectors find potential exhibits? What challenges accompany new technologies in the collection and preservation of art? 
## 1.1 Excursion: Input from the private collectors Ivo Wessel & Alain Servais

Even as a pupil, Ivo Wessel was enthusiastic about electronics, computers, contemporary art and literature. After his studies in computer science and psychology in Braunschweig, he worked as a software and iOS app developer, especially in the field of art. Since 2008, together with Olaf Stüber, he has presented the event series "Videoart at Midnight", video art screenings in the cinema Babylon in Berlin - once a month on a Friday, always at midnight. Currently, he is developing with Mario von Kelterborn a social media platform for the art scene a digital place where people can show art. Moreover, he is also a private collector and his collection includes conceptual art, concrete painting, photography, media and video art. Set within the Berlin art scene, it can be visited by appointment, except during Gallery Weekend and Berlin Art Week. As a collector, he is especially interested in dealing with media/ video art, its handling, maintenance, communication and presentation inside and outside the collection.

Alain Servais is an art collector in the international contemporary art field with a background in investment banking and a strong interest in video art and new media. For more than twenty years, the Servais Family Collection has focused on underrepresented and museum-quality art. Looking for both, core fundamentals and the emergent, the collection strengthens artistic positions that raise difficult questions about identity, materiality, corporeality, violence, racism, and death. Since 2000, The Servais Family Collection has occupied a 900-square-metre industrial space known as The Loft, where it is reimagined in a carefully-considered annual exhibition. Alain also runs an artist residency in Schaerbeek, a diverse neighborhood in Brussels. He also addresses the major hurdles and challenges of preserving, exhibiting and reproducing digital art as a collector and calls for all stakeholders in video art to collaborate with lawyers in setting meaningful international standards for the sale of digital art.

Jenny Starick is an art historian and assistant to the Head of Department at the ZKM Collection in Karlsruhe. For the collection, which has a globally unique stock of computerbased installations, video tapes and video installations, Jenny Starick is involved in the current collection exhibition in Karlsruhe and at the Gwangju Museum of Art in South Korea. She is part of the team developing a chatbot for art education and mediation, and is involved in the "digilog@bw" project linking science and art to advance a fruitful dialogue on digitality and digitisation. She is also working on the Web Residencies by Akademie Schloss Solitude and ZKM, which is dedicated to fostering young talent from the international digital scene as well as artists from all disciplines who engage with web-based practices. Today, she also highlights the work and projects of her colleagues from the Knowledge Department.
